

TENTATIVE PLAN OFALMA MATER SUMMER CAMP OF CKU ALUMNI & CHILDREN FROM N. AMERICA

(also abbreviated as: CKUSC for CKU Summer Camp)

I. Objective & Scope:

To provide an opportunity for the CKU (Cheng Kung University) Alumni &/or thier children or any Alumnus reccommended firends of Nothern America to visit the CKU campus, places of scenic beauty and historic interests. In this way, it is also hoped to achieve the following objectives:

- (1) The children would be able to be their parents' Alma Mater campus with/without their parents under CKU's tour guide;
- (2) The Alumni would be able to give lectures or form joint projects to help the further growth of the Alma Mater;
- (3) The next generation would have the chance of learning more Alma Mater as well as the Chinese culture, making friends and pen pals, sightseeing Taiwan, shopping,
- (4) Participants have to be 12 to 60 years old.

II. Program:

- (1) Duration & Time: 2 weeks (from July 8 - 15, 1989)
- (2) July 7 & 8: RECEPTION--CKU staffs will pick up the participants from Chiang Kai-Shek International Airport. Before that, each co-chair/team leader should have sent arriving schedule of each CKUAA chapter to CKU. Accomodation at student dormintory will be provided by CKU upon arrival. Those who do not need picked up at Airport should be sent to CKU by their relatives on July 7/8.
- (3) July 9(Sunday): INTRODUCTORY--CKU will provide an over-view of the arrangement and program. Teaching program material may be handed out. A tour throught the whole campus will be provided.
- (4) July 10(Monday):OPENING CEREMONY-- An introduction of CKU history and statistics or movie will be presented to the participants. New friends/pen pals will be introduced. There may be a welcoming dancing party.
- (5) July 11(Tuesday):CKU's lectures-- Elementary & advanced Chinese conversation/play classes and CKU's ongoing programs may be given to kids, teenagers and Alumni respectively.
- (5) July 12(Wednesday):OUTING to Tainan suburb; such as An-Ping2 Harbor; 学文 water reservoir;
- (6) July 13(Thursday):PARTICIPANT's lectures to CKU:Elementary &

Advanced English conversation/play classes and Alumni's lectures to CKU.

- (7) July 13(Friday): OUTING to Kaohsiung: visit to Harbor; Chung G~~ong~~; Cheng2ching Lake; .. Stay at Kaohsiung if possible.
- (8) July 14(Saturday): OUTING to Ken3Ding Park: see the national park at the south end of Taiwan. Back to CKU.
- (9) July 15(Sunday): TOURING Tainan & Shopping: such as Chih4Kang3 Low2; Downtown; Dep't store; Sagaliba
- (10) July 16(Monday): CKU's lectures-- Elementary & advanced Chinese history/politics and CKU's joint projects now & then..
- (11) July 17(Tuesday): OUTING to Taichung: Taichung Park; Chung Hsing Hsin Chun (New park)...Stay Taichung if possible.
- (12) July 18(Wednesday): OUTING to Sun-Moon Lake: and HsiTou2 National Park....Back to CKU.
- (13) July 19(Thursday): PARTICIPANT's lectures to CKU:Elementary & advanced American history/politics and Joint project proposals..
- (15) July 20(Friday): CLOSING CEREMONY: making conclusions to each others; going-away dancing party...
- (16) July 21(Saturday): DEPARTURE: CKU staffs will send participants to the Chiang Kai-Shek Airport or participants be picked up by their relatives.

III. Insurance and Sponsors:

- (1) Before departure of the airport in USA: Participants/thier parents.
- (2) During flight: by the airline company.
- (3) After arrival and before departure of CKS^{before} airport: CKU if picked up or driven to the CKS airport by CKU. Otherwise, CKU is only responsible after sent to and depart from CKU. Participants/their relatives are responsible during the gaps between their arrival/departure of CKS and the CKUSC programs.
- (4) CKU provides medical care and insurance due to transportation accidents if any.

IV. Fees:

- (1) Participants pay their own air flight fares (back & forth from USA to Taiwan (ROC) by them-selves or through the co-chair/team leader of each chapter;
- (2) Participants pay program expense with checks payable to CKUSC to Helen Chen, the treasurer of CKUSC before April 1, 1989.
